Subject: Open letter in response to your notice regarding "sudden deaths" among citizens

This open letter is in response to your notice (dated 10 Dec 2022) on various incidents of sudden deaths among Indians, especially among young and healthy. We appreciate your concern regarding this very important issue. This letter is to bring to your attention that your notice misses the elephant in the room with regard to the possible cause of these sudden deaths.

- 1. The adverse events caused by the Covid-19 vaccines are well known. Even the Govt. of India recently admitted in its affidavit filed in the Supreme Court that such adverse events can include death (Reference: [link]). It is also known that the official rates of adverse event reporting are gross underestimates. Publication reference: [link]
- 2. Worldwide, there has been an increase in cardiac and neurological issues time-correlated with the Covid-19 vaccine rollout. While correlation need not mean causation, the number of red flags are so many and this warrants serious investigation, especially given that Covid-19 vaccines are new, and much of the vaccines are even based on new technology. - 3. The issue of increased sudden heart attacks is unfortunately not recent. Data from Mumbai shows that such excess heart attacks have been seen since early 2021. The excess amount is staggering: even higher than the Covid-19 deaths in Mumbai. Reference: [link].
- 4. World renowned cardiologists such as Dr. Aseem Malhotra, Dr. Peter McCullough have called for a stop to the rollout of the mRNA Covid-19 vaccines, given the excessive rate of adverse events. Publication reference: [link].
- 5. A commonly held belief, based on hope rather than on evidence, is that the Covid-19 vaccines used in India (Covishield, Covaxin) are somehow safer than the mRNA vaccines. To the contrary, many European countries in fact stopped the use of Astrazeneca (Covishield) for the younger population, based on early data that it was causing a higher rate of adverse events. Reference: [link]. Several cardiac risks associated with Covishield are known to be at par or higher compared to the mRNA vaccines. Publication reference: [link].
- 6. It is staggering that Covid-19 vaccines have been rolled out for pregnant and lactating women while none of them have been tested on such women. (Reference: [link]). This is a serious issue of women's right-to-health, and must be raised by DCW.
- 7. Likewise, the effect of Covid-19 vaccines on women's menstruation is also not fully understood. (Reference: [link]). This too must be raised as a women's right-to-health issue by DCW, calling for a serious investigation.

The narrative that the rise in sudden deaths is due to Covid-19 has little evidence, and indeed, there were no such increased sudden deaths even in 2020, the peak pandemic year in much of the world. (Detailed writeup reference: [link]). However, one should not conclude without a serious investigation. We support an open and unbiased scientific investigation into the possible causes of the increased sudden deaths; the investigation must not exclude any possible cause, and must be free of any financial conflicts of interest.
